


Governor's Message



Chief Minister's Message

- The Chief Secretary was presiding over the meeting of the Crisis Coordination Committee meeting through video conferencing here today.
- Speaking on the occasion, she said that the officers should make a mechanism for sending the bank correspondent to every village to give financial benefits at their doorsteps to avoid mass gathering in banks. She said that online passes should be made for the bank correspondent and the police officers deployed on checkpoints should be directed to ensure their smooth movement.
- Talking over the issue of cash donations COVID-19, the Chief Secretary directed that the Deputy Commissioner that 'no cash donation' should be accepted, rather people should be made aware and encouraged to make digital donations. She directed that every Deputy Commissioners along with the DIPROs should ensure the wide publicity of the same.
- The Chief Secretary further directed to contain the movement of the migrant labourers at their current places across the State. She directed the Deputy Commissioners to keep a close vigil on the control and stop the movement of migrant labourers making inter districts movements and it should be ensured that they are asked to stay in the dedicated 'Relief Camps' set up across the State. She directed that the data of migrants including their contact number, Aadhar number, and residence address is to be complied by each district and the same should be made available online.
- She directed that a district-level crisis management coordination group should be made in each district to keep a check and track of action taken by the officers.
- Showing concern about the doctors, paramedics and health workers, involved in COVID-19 duty, she said that it should also be ensured that availability of essential medical equipments including, PPE kits, masks, sanitizers, and ventilators have been made for their safety.
- She directed that a list of all the retired doctors, exservicemen should be prepared and doctors from Ayush should also be included in this list. Apart from this rapid response teams of the doctors for each district should also be constituted.



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 She said that the availability of ventilators, PPE kits and oxygen cylinders in each hospital should be ensured. She directed that possibilities should be explored to find the production of PPE kits and the testing of these kits should be done as per the medical standards.

- She said that the availability of ventilators, testing kits, isolation beds should be reviewed. She said that number of private labs should be increased. She directed that a supervisor officer should be deployed for private labs and it should be ensured that new COVID-19 testing labs are to be set up. She said that the facility of telemedicine and mobile OPDs should be started soon.
- Raising the issue of the people living in slum areas across the State, the Chief Secretary directed that close vigil of the people living in these slums should be done and medical testing of such people should be ensured to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- She said that online training of NSS and NCC volunteers should be started for engaging them in various relief activities. She directed that special training should be impaired to the volunteers who are involved in taking care of the elderly living in old age homes.
- · Talking about the scenario of 'False news', the Chief Secretary said that IEC activities should be intensified in every district and action should be taken against those spreading 'False News'.
- · She further directed that the supply chain of essential commodities should also be ensured and the production of all the necessary goods and products should not be stopped. Apart from this, the movement of essential commodities coming from neighbouring states should also be done smoothly.
- · She shared that the cleanliness of Relief camps and thermal scanning of migrants living there should be done. She said that special focus should be laid on the cleanliness of toilets facilities made for the migrant labourers.

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
