

## Situation Update, Uttarakhand: 27/03/2020

WHO has declared the recent Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19) epidemic which affected around 185 countries as International Public Health Emergency Concern (PHEIC) under IHR (International Health Regulation). In this context, Uttarakhand Government has strengthened the surveillance and control measures against the disease.

Till, date 2768 persons from Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19) affected countries have been identified and tracked and all have been placed under surveillance. 774 persons have completed 28 days of observation after coming back from affected countries. 1894 persons are under observation as on today. 100 persons have been migrated out of state as on today and information provided to respective state.

A total of 368 samples have been collected for COVID-19 testing till date (including close contacts of positive case). Result of 317 samples received, 312 are negative and 5 are positive. Result of 51 samples is awaited.

Isolation facilities and Institutional Quarantine have been made operational in all districts and state is geared up to admit any person that needs institutional quarantine.

### **Public Health Action taken:**

- Uttarakhand government launched a Mobile App “Uttarakhand COVID-19 Tracking System” as a platform for people to report and self declare, if they are suspecting COVID-19 signs and symptoms. - To strengthen the gap of skilled manpower at district level, Secretary (Health), Govt. of Uttarakhand requested to Secretary (Ayush) Govt. of Uttarakhand to issue direction to the concerned that all the Ayurvedic and Homoeopathic Medical Officers and Paramedical staffs should temporarily be seconded to the Department of Medical health and Family Welfare and should report to the concerned Chief Medical officer of their respective districts at the earliest.
- To strengthen the process of contact tracing in field two satellite control rooms were set up today to strictly monitor and implement contact tracing in the state.
- Epidemic disease act has been implemented in the state for COVID 19.
- In exercise of the powers conferred by the Uttarakhand Epidemic Diseases, COVID-19 Regulations, 2020 under the Epidemic Diseases Act 1897, the Govt. of Uttarakhand has notified a lock down of non-essential services from 2100 hrs on 22 March 2020 to 23:59 hrs on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020
- Under COVID-19 Regulation 2020, Appeal released from Chief Secretary, Govt. of Uttarakhand to all the Community leaders to avoid any public meetings till next 15 days in order to follow social distancing to cut chain of transmission of COVID-19 infection.
- The entry of all tourists (both domestic and foreign nationals) is banned in the State of Uttarakhand till further orders.
- State Task Force under Chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Govt. of Uttarakhand has been constituted.
- To avoid mass gatherings Purnagiri devi Mela at Champawat district has been cancelled.
- Directives issued to close all schools, cinema halls etc.

### **APPEAL :**

Department of Health and Family Welfare, Uttarakhand appeals to all citizens of the state or foreign guests staying in Uttarakhand, who have returned from Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19) affected countries in last 14 days or came in contact of COVID-19 case, to call state control room number 0135-2609500/helpline number 104/District control room numbers (Annexed) to keep themselves and their families and society safe and protected from corona virus. Avoid non essential foreign travel.

### **Preventive measures :**

- Home quarantine of all asymptomatic travellers for next 28 days after returning from COVID-19 affected countries.
- Travellers and their families members must ensure strict respiratory and hand hygiene. Cover your face while coughing or sneezing, wash hands frequently and avoid hand shakes.
- Travellers coming to India from COVID-19 affected countries must report to district/block health authorities immediately if they develop any symptoms like fever, cough, cold or difficulty in breathing.
- Indian citizens are advised to refrain from non essential travel to COVID-19 affected countries.
- Hospital isolation of all symptomatic travellers if they have returned from any of COVID-19 affected countries.
- Minimal movement and interaction with outsiders.
- Frequent hand washing specially after touching any body secretions like saliva or nasal secretions.
